Mennonite World Conference: A delegation from CEFMC Goma who visited the church in Munigi in eastern DRC in November 2022 report finding many displaced persons (older people; pregnant and nursing women; children younger than 5, school-aged children, some of whom are separated from their parents) who lack sanitation facilities, food, potable water, clothing. *We pray* for needed supplies to reach the area and be equitably distributed. *We praise* the Lord for the nongovernmental organizations and for Église du Christ au Congo (association of churches) who are responding. *We pray* that the ceasefire regarding the M23 which Kenyan and Rwanda leaders are negotiating would be respected and sustained.
