Churchwide Announcements & Prayer Requests

From MCC: Since February, over 14 million Ukrainians have been forced to flee their homes and seek safety in areas within and outside Ukraine. At the same time, an ongoing humanitarian crisis has resulted in millions of Venezuelans leaving their home in pursuit of a safer future. For the first time in decades, the United States government has opened an avenue to allow private citizens and residents of the U.S. to respond to these crises by offering refuge to Venezuelans and Ukrainians through sponsorship.

On Tuesday, December 20 at 2:00 PM EST, join MCC and Church World Service to learn more from Dr. Katie Randall about these sponsorship programs, how they work, and how you can receive support as you welcome. Dr. Randall oversees the Church World Service Sponsor Group program for Venezuelans and Ukrainians. She provides training and technical assistance to sponsorship groups across the country as they welcome Ukrainian and Venezuelan newcomers.
