Red Lake Minnesota Mennonite Disaster Service (MDS) Service Trip – August 19-26, 2023:

In the summer of 2021, Red Lake, MN experienced a tornado with large, embedded hail damaging roofs, siding, windows, and doors of 78 homes. MDS will be repairing siding, windows, and doors.

Wayne Stucky, member of the Southern Hills Mennonite Church, Topeka, KS and past MDS Region 3 Board Chair is planning a MDS Service trip to Red Lake Minnesota. This is an invitation for volunteers (a total of 10) from the congregations of the I-70 churches. Volunteers - young or old, male or female, skilled or unskilled are welcome to fellowship together and share the Love of Jesus and bring hope to a community suffering a disaster. Red Lake is in a beautiful part of the country and the average temperature is around 77 degrees in August. The Red Lake Nation is home to the Ojibwe Indian tribe. Volunteers also can experience and learn a unique Native American culture during the week.

The proposed travel schedule:

- Saturday August 19 Leave Topeka 9am, travel to Lawrence Mennonite and Rainbow Mennonite Church to pick up volunteers then on to Albert Lea, MN for overnight.
- Sunday 8am travel to Red Lake, MN.
- Monday Friday work at the project until noon Friday.
- Friday Noon Leave Red Lake, MN travel to Albert Lea, MN for overnight.
- Saturday 8am, travel to Rainbow Mennonite and Lawrence Mennonite Church to drop off volunteers then on to Topeka, KS.

Provided: Van for transportation from Topeka, KS to Red Lake and back
